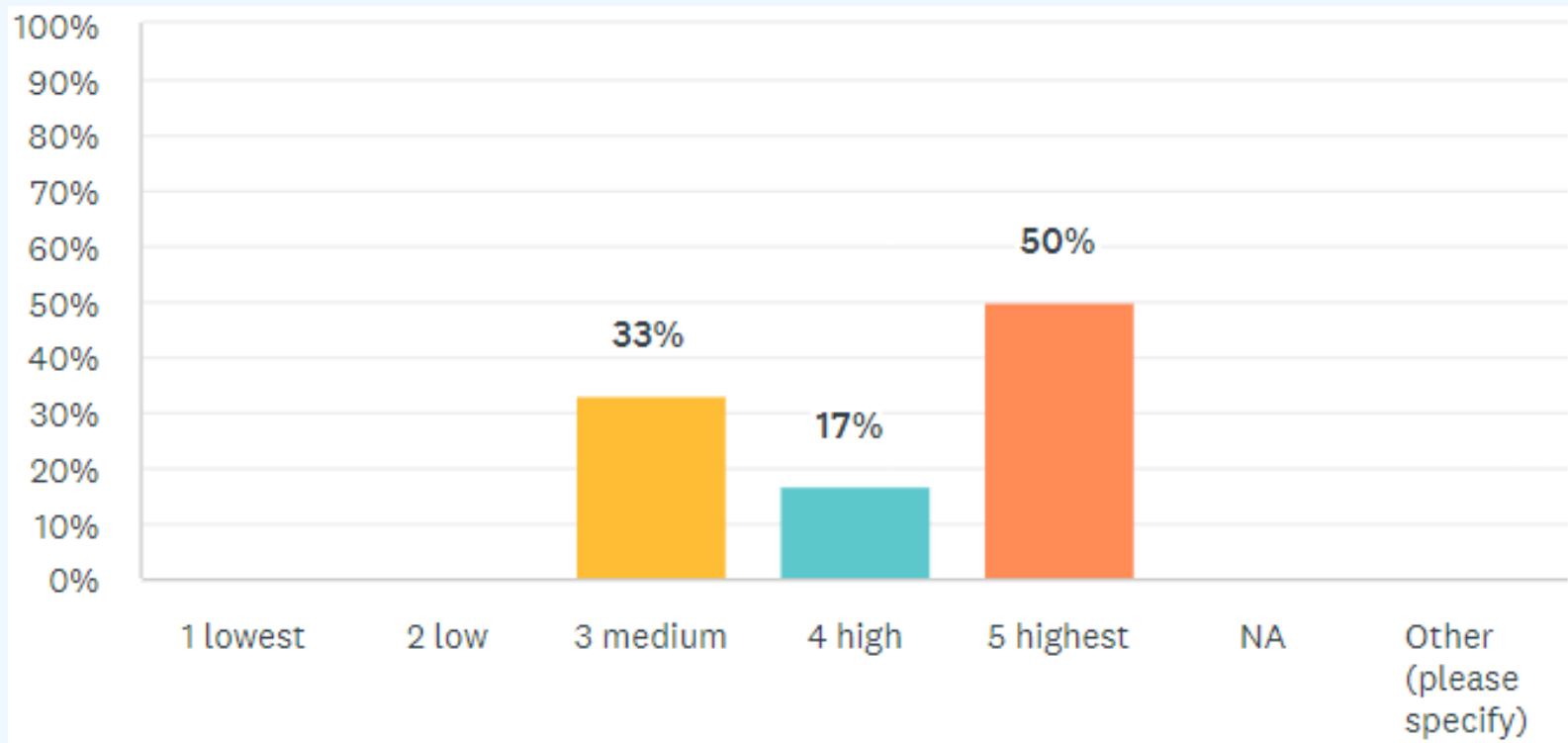
The instructors were very knowledgeable about their topics.



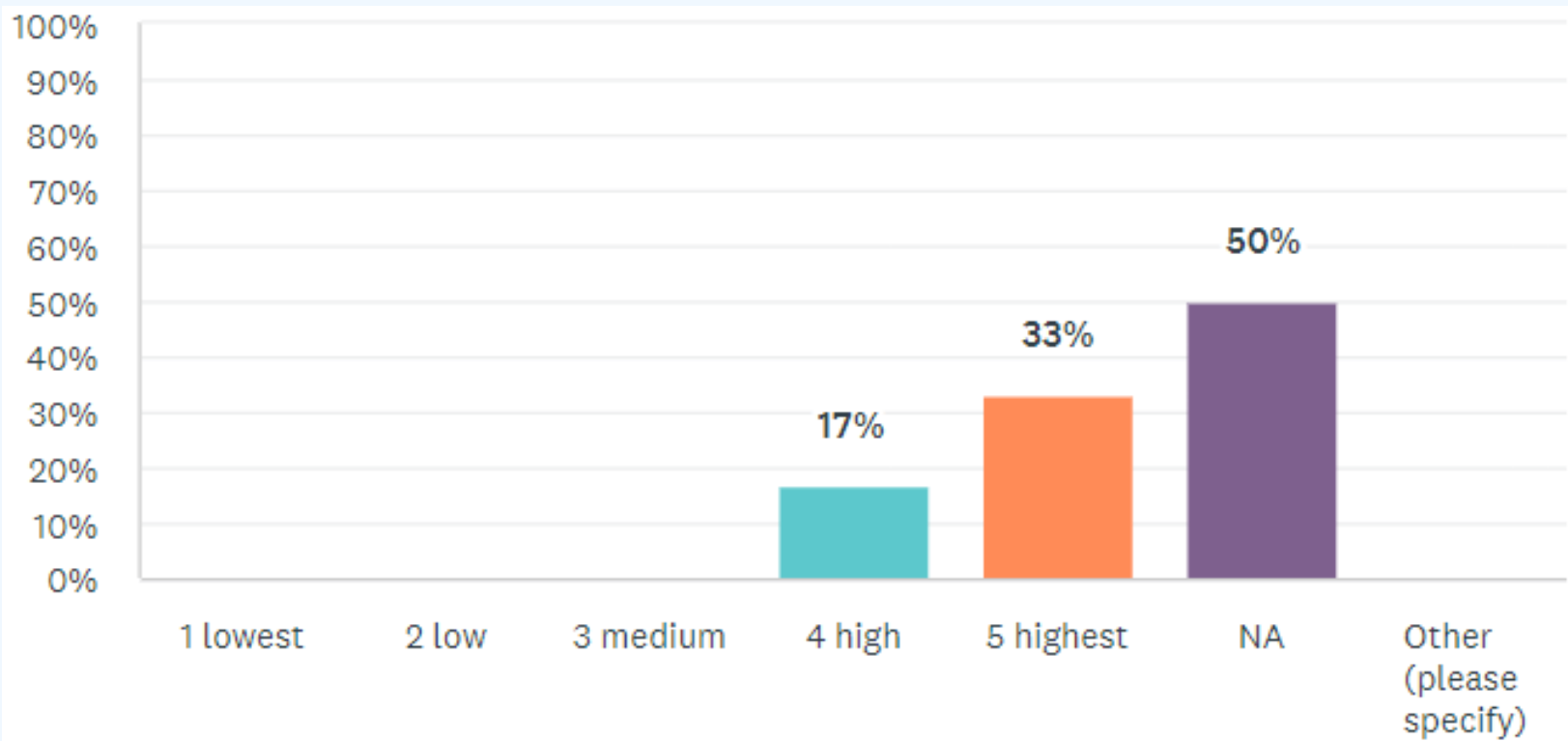
